2-day Manual Handling Passport - 8 places on each course

- To provide a standard for use in commissioning contracted services from care training providers.

Inanimate Load Handling Training – 12 places on each course

Fee: £25 per person for a 3 hour session

Aims and objectives of Passport Scheme:

- To promote the health, safety and wellbeing of those carrying out inanimate manual handling tasks.
- To ensure consistency in manual handling standards within participating organisations.
- To provide a minimum standard of safe manual handling in line with current legislation and best practice
- To develop a mechanism whereby skills can be transferred between organisations.

Modules covered:

Module A – Theory

- Legislation and health and safety guidance
- Causes and effects of musculoskeletal disorders (MSD)
- Prevention and management of Musculoskeletal Disorders (MSD)
- Ergonomics and risk assessment (including dynamic risk assessment) in reducing the risk of injury to self or others
- Principles of safer handling
- Team handling

Module B – Inanimate Load Handling & Practical Application of Ergonomics

- Principles of safer handling of loads including checking the weight of the load prior to handling
- Understanding formal and dynamic risk assessments
- Describe how the principles of safer handling can be applied to the movement of large or awkward loads
- Considerations for safe storage of loads, including at low levels and above shoulder height.
- Outline the importance of good posture and safely demonstrate the following techniques:
 - Pushing and pulling
 - Lifting and lowering a load from/to the floor or low level
 - Lifting and positioning a load from/to above shoulder level
 - Supporting & carrying a load
 - Correct posture whilst seated
 - Demonstrate basic safety checks of equipment as appropriate
 - Team handling

Completion of the above with Ceredigion County Council will entitle you access qualified & experienced trainers who can offer advice on complex handling cases and risk assessment

Who is this course for?

- New or experienced staff members
- Office workers, Catering staff, Domestic staff and caretakers etc.
- Staff who erect, dismantle and transport work equipment.
